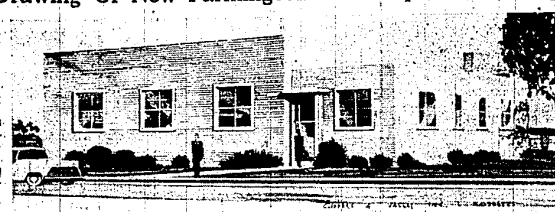


# Drawing Of New Farmington Bell Telephone Exchange



Work was begun Tuesday on the Michigan Bell Telephone Company building, to be located at Grand River and Power Road in the City of Farmington. The structure is part of a \$1,400,000 system which will bring dial telephone service to Farmington. The building is expected to be completed in December, 1954, with the system scheduled to go into operation in September, 1955.

## Resident Named In Charities Drawing

Farmington Township resident James J. Schlotterbeck, 25403 Beechhill, is among 50 Michigan residents having a chance to gain as much as \$50,000 for a designated charity of his choice. As part of a nation-wide Auto-Lite Family Charity Drawing to award a total of \$100,000 to charity, his name was selected this week at Auto Electric and Service Corporation in Detroit. The names of the 50 Michigan residents selected along with those from other states have been sent to New York City for a drawing of 25 winners on June 1.

The names of the winners in the contest will be announced on Auto-Lite's "Suspense" television program the night of June 1. The first place winner will be able to designate a charity or charities of his choice to receive \$50,000. The second place winner may designate \$20,000 for charity; third, \$5,000; fourth, \$3,000; fifth, \$2,000; and the remaining twenty selected, \$1,000 each.

Any charity recognized by the U. S. Treasury Department, large or small, religious or secular, local or national, may be designated to share in the \$100,000.

The drawings are being supervised by organizations affiliated with the American Automobile Association. More than 22,000 dealers for ten leading automobile companies served as registration headquarters during the program which closed May 3.

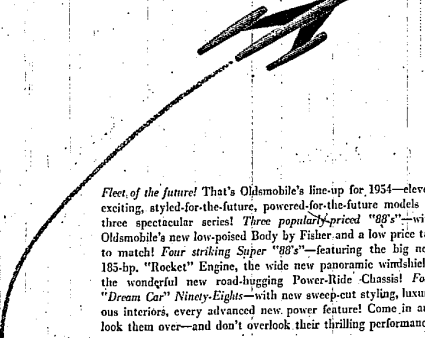

Mrs. Mattie Howard, who makes her home with her son Ray, is seriously ill.

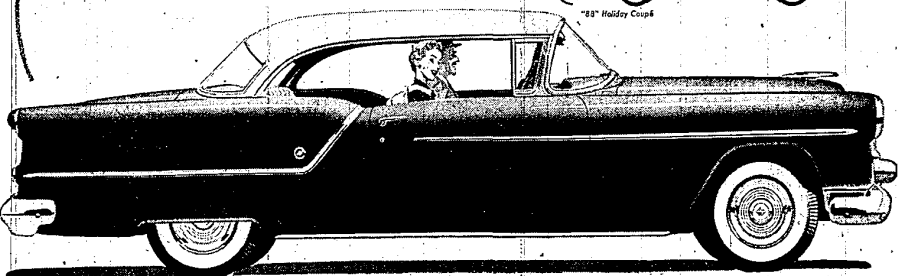
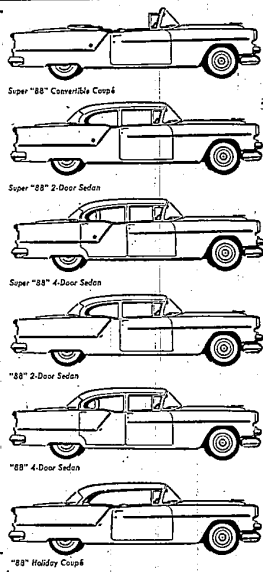

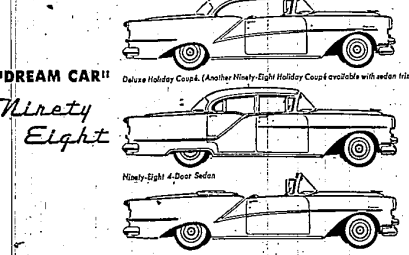
