ROADSIDE PICNIC TABLES NOW PLACED, STATE PARKS OPEN

The State Highway Department has now placed some 3,500 picnic tables at roadside parks and picnic table sites along state trunkline highways throughout the state. Highway Commissioner Charles M. Ziegler announced.

The State Highway Department now has 82 roadside parks, which have been built at natural beauty spots along the state trunkline system. These parks are equipped with sanitary toilets, outdoor stoves for cooking and all have excellent drinking water. An average of eight tables will be found in each park.

Michigan is considered the national leader in the development of roadside parks and picnic table sites. These roadside facilities have won widespread praise from people from other states and those from Michigan as well. The extensive use of the parks has led Commissioner Ziegler to increase the number of roadside parks each year.

In announcing that the roadside parks are now ready for use, Commissioner Ziegler issues a strong appeal to all who use the parks and picnic table sites to help keep them neat and attractive by avoiding misuse of the facilities offered and by depositing rubbish and garbage in containers which have been made available for such purposes.

- To introduce an amendment to Section 7 of the Ordinance providing for Compensation of Municipal Judge, Associate Municipal Judge, appointment of Court Clerk, etc.

Motion made by Nourjian and supported by Cavanaugh that L. N. Hayden, City Engineer, be and is hereby authorized to proceed with the design and plans for sewer interceptors and trunk lines and water mains extending from property known as Belle Aire Hills Subdivision to appropriate terminals as discussed and recorded previously in the records of Council Proceedings. Motion carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Nourjian and supported by Conroy that Ordinance amending Section 7 of ORDINANCE NO. 30-53, PROVIDING FOR COMPENSATION OF MUNICIPAL JUDGE, ASSOCIATE MUNICIPAL JUDGE, APPOINTMENT OF COURT CLERK AND DUTIES OF JUDGES be introduced. Motion carried, all yeas.

Motion to adjourn by Conroy supported by Lindbert. Motion carried, all yeas.

Boy Scout Camps Ready For Season; Early Camp-Out Registrations Heavy

Early registration for summer campouts led Boy Scout officials in and around the area to believe that a bigger than ever summer activity program is in store.

Two camps of the fine camping programs are the D-Bar-A Ranch near Metamora and the Scout Reservation near Brighton. The 1,400 acre D-Bar-A Ranch is equipped for unit camping, where Scout Troops and Explorer Posts may camp under their own leaders.

In addition to troop camps, Scout camps of horseback riding, burro packing, trail cooking, skeet shooting, archery, Indian lore, rope twirling, fly and bait casting.

The Scout Reservation near Brighton also offers two plans of camping, troop and individual. Where troop leadership is not able to do troop camping, individual Scout leaders, parents or even larger groups may join a Provisional Troop at the reservation, where leadership and meals are provided by the Council.

Both camps have resident staffs available for guidance and counsel. Several members of the council executive staff also have been assigned to direct or assist in the operation of both camps.

Scout groups are reminded that if they are planning to conduct a camping program at off-Council sites such as state parks or private property are required by state law to register through the Council office. By so doing the Council is able to help the unit "ginger out" on its own. Registering through the Council also helps qualify the unit for an official camping certificate from the camping service.

Eye Exercises Will Not Help Vision, Expert Says

Spectacle wearers had better be content with the sharp vision their glasses provide, rather than try through eye exercises to make the lenses unnecessary.

Dr. William C. McKeenolds of the University of Michigan's Department of Ophthalmology states: "A person cannot change his eyes for glasses by so-called eye exercises any more than he can influence his height. Any improvement of vision noted after such exercises has been shown to be due to the person's ability to interpret blurred images - just as deaf persons can learn to read lips.

"Glasses are not crutches and they cannot weaken our eyes, as physical culturist Bernarr MacFadden would have us believe."
