FINAL PLANS MADE TO BOMB STATE IN 'OPERATION ALERT'

Detroit and Flint, both critical target areas, are the only Michigan cities to be bombed theoretically during "Operation Alert," the nationwide civil defense training exercise scheduled for June 14 and 15. Other communities in the state, if they so desire, may hold local exercises on these dates. To avoid these exercises do not include the simulated use of nuclear weapons.

Purpose of the test is primarily to promote increased operations capability of civil defense forces at all levels of government, particularly to test state and federal aid potential to stricken cities under conditions of widespread attack.

The Michigan Office of Civil Defense, as its part in the exercise, will determine to what extent the resources of the state government, and of arms of the state not involved in the exercise, could satisfy the requirements of Detroit and Flint if the mock bombing were a reality. In order that up-to-date civil defense information on the resources of counties and municipalities not participating in the exercise may be available, local civil defense directors have been asked to furnish such information to the state office.

The state office will evaluate its potential aid to Detroit and Flint, theoretically sending what it has and requesting additional support from the FCDA regional headquarters at Joliet, Illinois. From that point on, the solution becomes a federal problem.

Seaman Kemp Serving Aboard Manchester

Seaman Kenneth A. Kemp, U. S. N., son of Mr. and Mrs. K. G. Kemp, of 21407 Power Road, is serving aboard the light cruiser USS Manchester as part of the US Navy Patrol. A Naval release disclosed this week.

Sailors aboard the Manchester had the distinction of being among the first Americans to observe Easter this year when the ship crossed the International Date Line en route to the Far East. With the crossing of the line, the ship's clocks were rolled forward, eliminating Saturday and bringing Easter a day earlier.

New Barn To Be Erected At Detroit Race Course

The new barn, which will cost approximately \$875,000, will be of modern cement-block construction similar to the majority of the barns on the grounds which were erected when the track opened in 1950. POSSIBILITY OF BIG NORTHVILLE OIL FIELD UNKNOWN

What are the possibilities of a big oil field developing in the Northville area? State conservation department geologists say they will know better after "core" tests have been made of rock in the Trenton formation.

To date, no uncrushed samples of the rock have been brought to the surface for testing. When they are, tests will determine how many tiny pore spaces the rock contains and how much connection there is between the pores.

These two factors — porosity and permeability — are vitally necessary before oil can be drawn to the surface.

To think of oil as lying in "pools" beneath the surface, like underground lakes, is a generally erroneous idea, the geologists say.

Petroleum is "most often found in veins of rock containing countless tiny holes, all connected one to the other by microscopic passages.

Only occasionally is a "pool" found, where rock formations have fractured and shifted, forming underground openings into which oil is able to seep.
