Several city officials indicated, however, that they would like to see the township officials remain in the city and offer to work with the township on the matter.

A letter, which had been received from Ernest Blanchard, Township Supervisor, prior to the meeting, was read by Loomis. Blanchard, in the letter, asked the city what they would require for the city's 15% ownership in the Town Hall or what it would be willing to pay for the 80% township interest. Blanchard stated at the meeting that the township is seriously concerned with the shortage of office space. He added that the city and township should join together in the library project, but that he was concerned with the lack of parking area around the Town Hall site. Harry McCracken, Township Clerk, stated that he wanted to see the Town Hall remain as an important landmark and felt that a separate library building should be constructed rather than an addition.

A number of other members of the City Council and Township Board voiced the opinion that they felt a separate building should be erected instead of an addition.

Hal Whitting, Farmington architect, was introduced by V. O. Bates in behalf of the Friends of the Library. Whitting read a report which he had compiled at the request of the Friends of the Library. He stated that the minimum size required for a new Farmington library would be 4,000 square feet, which could be built at an estimated cost of approximately \$40,000. This would include library space as well as a community room.

Mrs. Fred Cook, member of the Library Board, stated at the close of the meeting that the joint meeting was a wonderful display of cooperative spirit and constructive action.

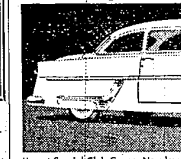
