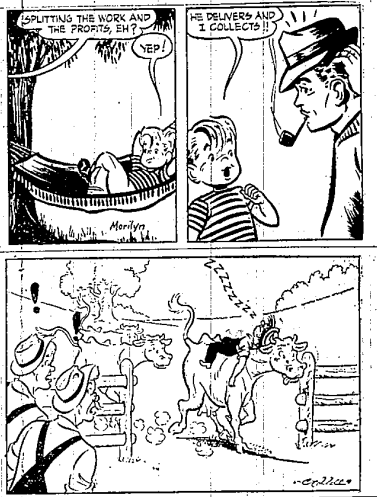

### Local Boy Takes Part In Cruise Around The World

Naval gunner's mate Roger A. Kaiser, ward of Mr. and Mrs. Percy E. Warner of 21301 Colgate Street, recently returned to the States aboard the U. S. S. "Albatross" after completing an "around the world" cruise with ships of the Destroyer Division 222, the Navy disclosed.

During the cruise the ships served with the UN Peace Patrol in the Far East. They passed over three oceans and nine seas. The crew earned the Korean Service and United Nations Service ribbons and were initiated into the famous order of Golden Dragon for crossing the International Date Line; the Ancient Order of the Deep, for crossing the Equator; and the Order of Madellan, sailing around the world.
