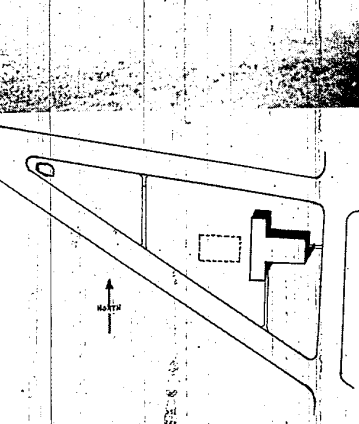
ANNOUNCE NEW POST OFFICE BOX RENTAL SYSTEM

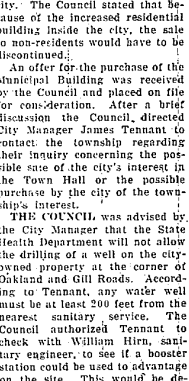
