

## Pheasant Damage To Corn Field Can Be Reduced

Pheasant damage to cornfields can often be avoided by spreading shell or ear corn along the field edges, game workers say.

In the spring, when corn sprouts are young and soft, pheasants sometimes cause nuisance damage by eating whole rows of the young plants.

Some farmers have found that the corn serves as a decoy or bait to keep ringnecks from entering the cornfields.
