### HAWKS, OWLS TO BE PROTECTED BY LAW AFTER AUGUST 12

At long last, hawks and owls are going to he protected by law. The recent Michigan Legislature passed an act, signed into law by the governor, that extends protection to the birds. The law ends a long fight by conservationists, Audubon Society members, the MUCO and other state groups to spare hawks and owls from indiseriminate killing.


