EQUIPMENT MASSED FOR CONSTRUCTION OF STRAITS BRIDGE
The largest and one of the most costly fleets of floating construction equipment ever assembled by a contractor for a single mission has been massed by Merritt-Chapman & Scott Corporation for its work on the substructure of the Mackinac Straits Bridge.

Approximately 50 pieces of floating equipment, most of it newly built to meet the special requirements of the project, are being called into play to construct the two piers of reinforced concrete that will carry the five-mile bridge across the Straits.

Major items in the fleet, valued at approximately \$1,000,000, range from 10 powerful wherry derricks to five work boats used, among other things, to shuttle "personnel" to and from construction sites and across the Straits. Among other craft brought together to serve the project are five tugboats and approximately 20 material and equipment barges. The barges are being used to transport concrete for concreting operations. Two equipped for welding operations, and two covered cement barges.

The derricks, called "wherry barges," are being used to erect the bridge's main spans. They can also be rigged to serve as floating pile drivers.

NEW THRILL RIDE TO BE FEATURED AT STATE FAIR
If you ever have wanted to know how it feels to be suspended in mid-air, the chance will be yours at the Michigan State Fair, September 3 through 13.

James H. Hare, general manager, announces that the State Fair has secured the European ride sensation, the rotor, for this year's Fair. The rotor is a fan-making version of a device that was originally used to test the effects of spinning at high velocities upon flying cadets.

The ride uses the physical principle of centrifugal force and allows the riders to spin suspended in mid-air. They walk into an excited maze and take their places. As the drum increases the number of revolutions per minute to 30, which is about three feet at the fast blink of an eye, the floor suddenly drops away, leaving the patrons safely held in position by the outward force.

The rotor is an entirely new ride, and the only one of its kind in the world. It is nearly two years in the making, weighs 20 tons, and is made of stress-treated steel at a cost upward of \$100,000.

It will be the first appearance of the device in the Midwest.

Rising Juvenile Delinquency Rate Recorded In State

Juvenile delinquency is increasing faster in Michigan than in the nation as a whole and a growing number of cases involve violence, a panel of authorities said at Michigan State College's Forum in State and Local Government.

But despite the black picture supplied by statistics, "We don't think our kids are going to be the next generation of hoodlums," said panel chairman Sam Rabinowitz, executive secretary of the Michigan Youth Commission.

One reason for the boost in juvenile cases is the fact that courts now are seeing in more complete reports of juvenile crime. Another reason is that more delinquents are coming to the attention of law enforcement agencies and other groups which are better equipped to deal with delinquents.

In 1948 in America, Rabowitz said, there were 300,000 juvenile cases brought to the attention of courts. This figure jumped to 450,000 in 1953, a total of \$25,000,000. In Michigan, the 1948 figure was 5,415, compared with \$4,500 in 1953, an increase of 60 per cent.

Rabinowitz said the age of a juvenile delinquent is figured at 10 to 17. The largest number of juvenile cases involve stealing, larceny and extortion, and driving away cars. But cases involving violence are increasing.

Figures can be very misleading, said Oakland County Probate Judge Arthur E. Moore. He said increases in population, informal and formal cases, repeated offenses and other factors should be taken into account.

Assailing the system of handling delinquents in Michigan, Moore said that many cases should be decided from the children's standpoint. "They are more important than the parents," he said.

Prune Trees To Keep Trunk, Shrubs Neat
