meeting with Wayne County officials will be held as soon as arrangements can be completed.

A large delegation of residents appeared before the Board to seek action on the cleaning up of the property located at 28334 Orchard Lake Road north of Eight Mile Road. The house, which is presently unoccupied, has been condemned by the Township Health Officer. The residents emphasized that they were concerned about the condition of the grounds as well as the house, because of the presence of rubbish which is serving as a nesting place for vermin. A. C. Leonard, Township Attorney, who was present at the meeting, stated that he would discuss the situation with the Health Officer with the view of possible legal action.

The Board also requested Leonard to check into the legal aspects of setting up a township-wide rubbish and garbage collection. The investigation is to include the possible methods of financing such a program as well as the recommended procedure to follow.

Apple Crop Short In Some Varieties

If the only apples that will satisfy your taste are the Delicious variety, you'll probably find fewer or smaller and higher prices in Michigan.

That is the word from George Motts, Michigan State College marketing specialist. Though the total state apple crop will be 14 per cent below average, Delicious will be much below that.

Imports from supplies in other areas may take up the slack here, though.

The Michigan apple crop is forecast at about 3.7 million bushels, or about 10 per cent below 1953. There will be a moderate supply of Jonathans and Macintosh. However, if your favorite is the Northern Spy, they will be a good buy this year.

Motts emphasized that the price is tied to the overall U. S. crop and the consumer purchasing power, rather than the Michigan production only. And the U. S. crop will be plentiful.

It is early, as yet, to make final predictions on the total crop, especially on prices. More complete and accurate forecasts can be made around September 1. Motts added.

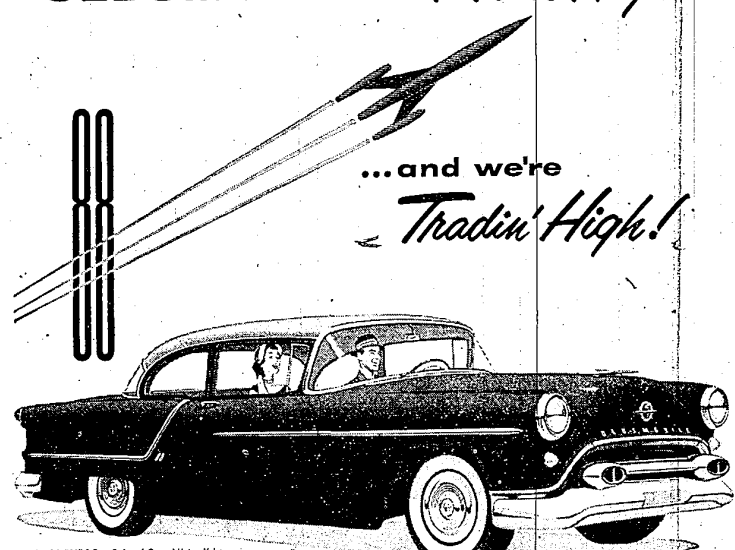

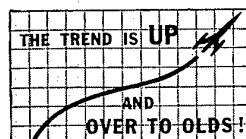
