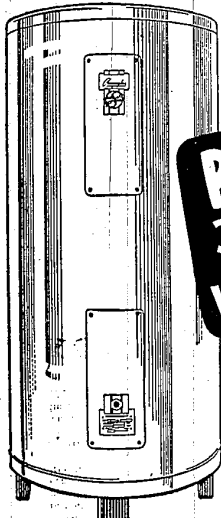

HUNTERS ENJOY 12,000 YEARS OF RECREATION IN '54

In the pheasant and deer seasons last year Michigan hunters enjoyed a total of more than 12,000 years' worth of hunter days of recreation, the conservation department reports.

Quite apart from any game that was bagged and taken home, Michigan hunters went afield, enjoyed sunshine and woodlands, shivered in cold weather, cussed at cantankerous dogs or passed the day's hunting companions to an extent never before experienced in the state.

During all this, the tedious of office and factory was forgotten, dollar dilemmas and political bickering were pushed aside and, in general, the purposes of recreation were served.

The "12,000 years' worth of hunter days of recreation" was computed from the following figures: During the regular deer season about 45,000 persons went afield. Each hunted an average of about 3.5 days. During the special deer season another 100,000 persons hunted. In pheasant season an estimated 530,000 persons hunted. Each hunted an estimated 3.5 days.

No Rabid Foxes As Yet Reported In Michigan

For some unexplained reason, no rabid foxes have even been reported found in Michigan, conservation department workers report.

Rabies has been discovered in foxes in Minnesota, Wisconsin, Illinois, Indiana and Ohio, but to date health authorities have no record of the disease in any Michigan fox.

However, a rabid raccoon has been found in recent years and a few rabid skunks have been found during each recent year.

Any of a number of mammals common to Michigan is susceptible to the dread disease and anyone nipped by any wild animal should try and get the offending creature to health department or conservation authorities for observation. If the animal must be killed in the process, the head should be preserved for laboratory analysis.

Police To Enforce New State Law Requiring Turn Signals On Trucks

Drivers of most commercial vehicles are now barred from signaling turns by hand and are required to use signaling equipment, such as signal lamps, to warn other drivers. The requirement is made under a new law which became effective last Friday, August 13. The same law also requires owners to have the needed turn signaling equipment installed.

Local and state law enforcement officials warn a crackdown will be made on all owners of commercial vehicles not adhering to these requirements.
