atives but they report that university officials did not approve the idea, that the game will be played in Ann Arbor.

Official beginning of the Centennial observance will be February 12, Lincoln's birthday. This is considered appropriate because it was Lincoln who signed the Morrill Act which provided for the establishment of land-grant education institutions.

The opening ceremony will be called Founders' Day. It will be a "cap and gown" affair to which many of the outstanding educators of the world will be invited. A distinguished leader in education will be announced as speaker.

The entire program is controlled by a Centennial Committee made up of MSC administration people, students, alumni and citizens.

It is headed up by Jim Denison, executive assistant to President John A. Hannah.

There are special sub-committees to plan for the anticipated crowds. One for invitations, housing and food, awards and citations; even traffic.

When the celebration is complete, MSC officials hope they have demonstrated that the first 100 years were very productive; that the next century can bring even greater accomplishments.
