Oakland County Air Tour Planned

Plans have now been completed for the Oakland County Soil Conservation District Air Tour to be held Wednesday, September 1, with everyone interested in the future and betterment of agriculture in Oakland County invited.

In the event of bad weather, the tour program will be changed to Thursday, September 2. Flights will be held between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Flights will start at the Pontiac City Airport, five miles west of Pontiac on M-59. To be conducted on a regular schedule, the flights will cover the northwest, southwest, and northeast quarters of the county. A briefing will be given prior to the flights, showing points of interest to be observed. Conservation practices to be observed will be diversion ditches, terrace systems, tree planting, a side hill left in sod, strip cropping, drainage ditches, contour orchards and sod waterways.

The Michigan Flying Farmers, Soil Conservation Service and the Oakland County Extension Service are cooperating with the district in this project.

Extended Fall Rainbow Date Set September 1

The extended fall rainbow trout season gets under way September 1 on a large number of lakes and streams and will continue through the end of November, the conservation department reports.

The regular trout season is open on designated lakes and streams until September 12, but the extended season opens a large group of other waters for the months that rainbows are in migration.

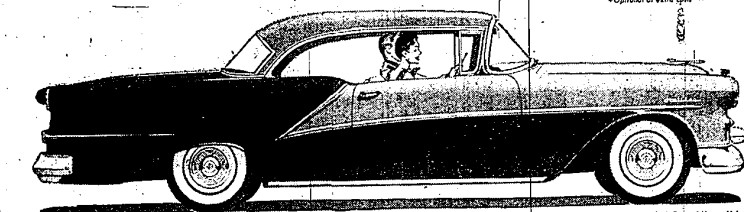
Waters in 61 counties, in addition to most Great Lakes waters, will be open for the fishing. Certain Dickinson, Isabella and Livingston County waters will be open to the fall fishing this year for the first time, and the total statewide list includes about 90 streams and about 160 lakes.

Anglers interested in the fall season may request lists of waters to be open from the department's fish division at Lansing, 25, or from local district conservation headquarters offices.
