

TROUT STREAMS IN STATE TO BE PUT UNDER EXPERIMENT

About 30 miles of trout streams in Michigan will be placed under experimental and management fishing restrictions on January 1, 1955, as a result of recent conservation commission action.

In general, the restrictions involve "flies only" or increased size limit regulations on portions of seven state streams.

The streams affected include five miles of the East Branch of the Fox River in Schoolcraft County, four miles of the Boardman River in Grand Traverse County, 4.5 miles in the Little South Branch of the Pere Marquette in Newaygo County, 16.4 miles on the South Branch of the AuSable in Crawford County and six miles on the North Branch of the AuSable in Crawford County. All these are slated on an experimental basis.

Details of the restrictions will be listed in the 1955 fish and game report, slated for publication later this year.

Farmington Grid Hopefuls To Get Gear Saturday

Farmington football candidates will start drills Monday morning with equipment to be issued to all varsity troouts Saturday morning starting at 9:00 o'clock, grid mentor Earl Hagedorn disclosed.

A special invitation is extended to all new students and boys previously not out for the team. According to Coach Hys, there will be plenty of vacancies on the squad to be filled. The varsity squad will carry between 30 and 35 men this year, he stated.

Anyone interested in trying out for the team who has not yet received a physical examination card may pick one up at the high school office.

Practice sessions for the varsity will be held twice daily starting Monday with a full scrimmage planned for Labor Day, Monday, September 6. Morning practice sessions will run from 9:00 to 11:00 with chalk talks slated from 1:00 to 2:00 p.m., followed by another two hours of drilling from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m.

Practitioners will not start practicing until after school starts. All candidates will report for equipment on the first day of school with practices to start as soon afterwards as possible.

MUST APPLY FOR EXTRA DEER PERMITS EARLY

Applications for hunting permits for Michigan's special deer season on December 1 in the northern lower peninsula must be postmarked not later than October 10, the conservation department emphasizes.

The drawing will take place "on or about October 20," Gerald E. Eddy, director of conservation, announces.

Applicants must: (1) purchase a regular firearm deer-hunting license; (2) obtain application forms from the license dealer; (3) file the form, not instructed, giving first and second choices of hunting areas desired.

Complete details of how and where to apply will be provided with the application blanks. The applications must be completely and accurately filled out or they will not be considered in the drawings.

Application forms, scheduled for printing within the next few weeks, will be available from license dealers probably sometime in September.

For the Allegan special season, applications should be made the same as in previous years, and should be postmarked not later than October 1 - as in past years.

Opening Drills For Trojan Gridders Set For Monday

First practice sessions for Clarenceville High School gridders hopefuls have been set for Monday morning at nine o'clock by Trojan mentor Nick Ianni, with drills to continue twice daily after this time until the start of school.

About 35 varsity candidates are expected with 25 more anticipated to answer first call as freshmen. With ten lettermen lost through graduation and two more having dropped out of school, the Clarenceville coach will have a big rebuilding job to do.

"We only six returning lettermen around which to build a team. Coach Ianni states that the Trojan chances for another season as successful as last year look a little bleak. The Clarenceville eleven had their best season in years last fall when they placed third in the tough Wayne - Oakland League.

"This lack of seasoned performers may hamper early season successes," the Trojan mentor said, "but the latter part of the year may offer some surprises."

The Trojans will take on the Farmington Falcons in the season opener on Friday, September 17. The game will be played at Clarenceville.

Hormones For Sheep May Get Approval

There's a good chance that the use of hormone implants in feedlot lambs will get the green light this fall from the Federal Food and Drug Administration.

That's the word from H. A. Henneman, a Michigan State College sheep researcher who experimented with the implants. The scientist found that the hormones - a combination of progesterone and estradiol - made lambs gain 15 to 25 per cent better than others, and on less feed.

Laboratory tests at the college also showed that the lamb meat was not affected from the hormones. The federal agency, however, is conducting further tests to make sure.

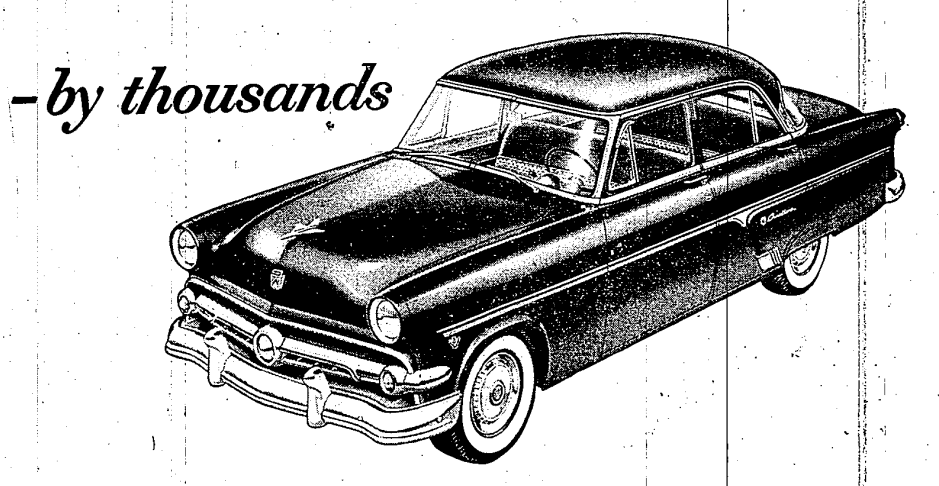
