Don West, regular tackle last season, will be out of action this season because of a knee injury.

to the eastern section of the city was reduced to about one-half and extra police control was secured to halt all outside use of water. Tennant emphasized that the Lion Club street auto wash held Saturday had "absolutely nothing to do with the drop in water." The Manager stated that following the project the pressure was normal and the storage tank contained about 130,000 gallons of water.

Throughout most of Sunday, city residents filled jugs and tubs wherever they could find a source of drinking water. The Farmington Dairy, which has its own well, was one of the principal suppliers. Others traveled as far as Northville to get water. In the meantime Floyd Sallow, superintendent of Public Works, and Tennant attempted to secure equipment to pull the pump in an effort to restore service as quickly as possible. A crane was finally secured from the Detroit Edison Company and the pump was lifted from the well. However, a shortage of one shaft adapter halted operations until Monday morning, when work was renewed.

Visitors Welcome At Cranbrook Labor Day

Although the museums of Cranbrook Academy of Art and Cranbrook Institute of Science will be closed Labor Day, September 6, Christ Church Cranbrook and the Guithe of Cranbrook House will be open to visitors.

Christ Church Cranbrook, notable for its frescoes, stained glass, wood and stone sculptures, and 52-foot earthen, is open to the public daily from 9 to 5 except during services.

The Gardens of Cranbrook House, 40 landscaped acres surrounding the home of the late Mr. and Mrs. George G. Booth, founders of the six Cranbrook Institutions, will be open Labor Day from 2:30 to 5:30 p.m. and on Saturday and Sunday afternoons through October.




