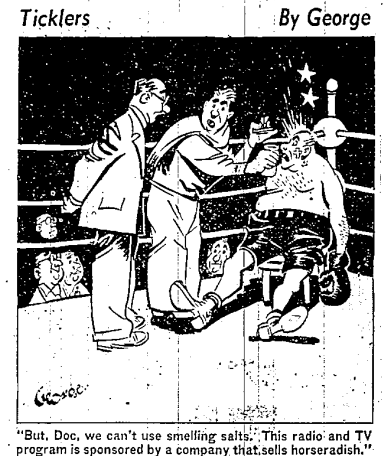
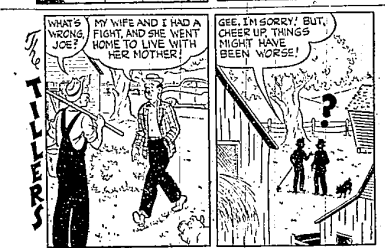




WEEKLY CROSSWORD PUZZLE

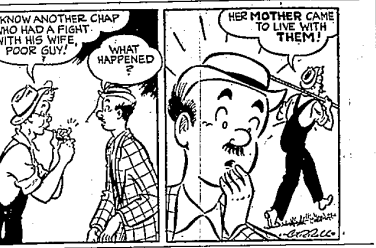
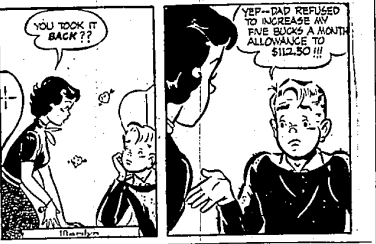
