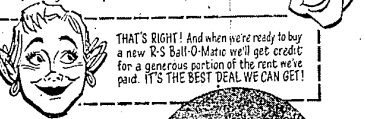

## Kiwanis Kids' Day Program Praised By Noted Leaders In Varied Fields

Acknowledged leaders in every field of endeavor have given their personal stamp of approval to the 1954 Kids' Day, sponsored by Kiwanis International.

Kids' Day, which will be observed in Farmington on Saturday, September 25, is now six years old. This year, however, marks the first time that Kiwanis has exclusive sponsorship of Kids' Day.

Numbered among the famous personages saluting the youth of the United States and Canada on Kids' Day are United States Senator Karl E. Mundt from South Dakota; George Halas, president of the Chicago Bears professional football team; Dr. Ralph Sackman, pastor of Christ Methodist Church in New York City; Ralph A. Tudor, Undersecretary of the Interior; Captain Eddie Rickenbacker, rhamtman of the board of Eastern Airlines; and United States Senator Spessard Holland of Florida.

Senator Karl E. Mundt, a member of the Senate Investigation Subcommittee who recently assisted in an inquiry into juvenile delinquency in America, said: "Sincere congratulations to Kiwanis for its sponsorship and promotion of Kids' Day on September 25."

"As usual, Kiwanis is in the forefront on special projects which deal with the welfare of young citizens."

George Halas, the "father of professional football in America," whose Chicago Bears have been seven times national champions, said: "Kiwanis' long and well-known record of youth activity makes sponsorship of Kids' Day a natural for the organization. Speaking for the Bears, I am happy to salute Kiwanis for their sponsorship of Kids' Day and to wish them much success both this year and for many years to come."

Dr. Ralph Sackman, widely known radio personality and pastor of the Christ Methodist Church in New York City, said: "Kiwanis is indeed has rendered service to youth in the past. The new proposal of Kids' Day strikes me as a splendid addition to an already outstanding program."

Mr. Ralph A. Tudor, Undersecretary of the Interior, said: "I understand that this observance (Kids' Day) is designed to focus the attention of the American public on the crucial importance of today's youth, its problems such as juvenile delinquency, and its many accomplishments. This: undertaking deserves the full backing of all Americans who recognize that the activities of our youngsters today are molding the citizens of tomorrow."

Captain Eddie Rickenbacker, world famed aviator pioneer and World War I ace and chairman of Eastern Air Lines, said: "Heart-

iest congratulations to Kiwanis International for sponsoring Kids' Day September 25, when hundreds of thousands of youngsters of America will be feted in thousands of communities throughout this great country of ours."

"But it should be even a greater day for the rest of us, if we would just take a few minutes to realize the importance of youth in the pattern of our lives, as they will be the leaders of tomorrow."

"It is too easy to forget that a country, like a family, relies for its strength and progress on the continuous parade of youth."

"It is my hope, therefore, that everyone will do his or her share toward helping Kiwanis International in making Kids' Day this year the most successful one yet."

United States Senator Spessard Holland said: "I am delighted to learn that Kiwanis International has assumed sole proprietorship of Kids' Day. Certainly, today, our hopes for the future lie with our young people. Kids' Day recognizes the role of youth in present day society and actively fosters good citizenship. ... Kids' Day is a wonderful American idea ... one which deserves the active support of all Americans."

Kiwanis Kids' Day in Farmington will be celebrated with a free show at the Civic Theatre on Saturday morning, September 25. Doors will open at 9:30 a.m. with attractions to be shown the youngsters to end by noon.

A color western movie and eight color cartoons will be shown to all children under 14 years of age.

On the same day Kiwanians and their helpers will be selling peanuts at various points in the Farmington area. All proceeds will go toward future youth projects for Farmington youngsters.

## Rainbow Fishing Season Open Until November 30

Michigan's general trout season ended September 12.

Brook and brown trout may no longer be taken, but rainbows will continue to be legal quarry on a large number of lakes and streams until November 30.

The extended season on rainbows gives fishermen a once-a-year opportunity to catch the big ones as they migrate from the cold water of the Great Lakes into warmer streams and inland lakes.

Waters in 61 counties will be open to this special trout fishing this year. Lists of these lakes and streams are available at no cost from the coast guard department's fish division at Lansing 26, Michigan.

Major speakers will include Wanda Stoddard, president of the Michigan division of the American Cancer Society, and C. Allen Payne, Grand Rapids medic, who is chairman for the Michigan Cancer Society.

For Coordinating Committee. Jack Pickering, Detroit Times, winner of the first Michigan State Medical Society award for outstanding medical reporting, will be the featured speaker at the noon luncheon on Friday, October 15.

Up-to-date information about cancer control will be given on cancer in children, cancer of the lung, and breast cancer.
