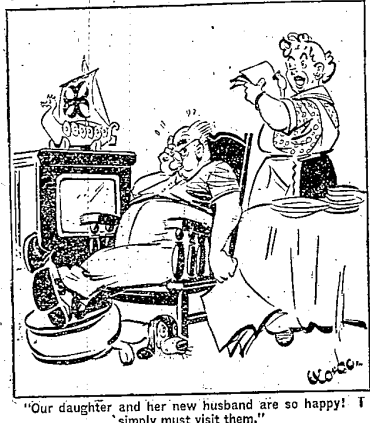

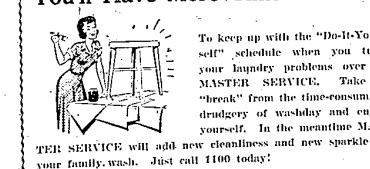

Orders For Trees Being Accepted By State

Orders for young trees to be planted this fall will be accepted by the conservation department through October 23, state foresters report.
A request by card or letter to the department's forestry division at Lansing will bring an order blank and price list.
White, red and jack pine seedlings and transplants are available. Buyers must use them for reforestation, windbreaks on farms, or Christmas tree production. They cannot be used for ornamental purposes.
This year's tree planting conditions are ideal, say the foresters. Colder weather and a few light frosts hardened the nursery stock and recent rains conditioned the soil.

Basic First Aid Course Offered By Red Cross

Persons interested in learning first aid should hurry down to Royal Oak.
Ralph S. Forman, chairman of first aid for the Oakland County Chapter of Red Cross has announced a course in standard first aid at the Royal Oak Elks Club, 205 South Troy Avenue.
Mr. Forman says this is a 22-hour course, two hours of which will be spent in special civilian defense training.
On September 14 a class in advanced first aid will begin in the Grant School, also in Royal Oak.

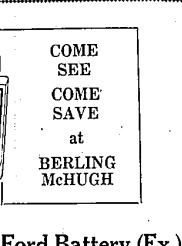
