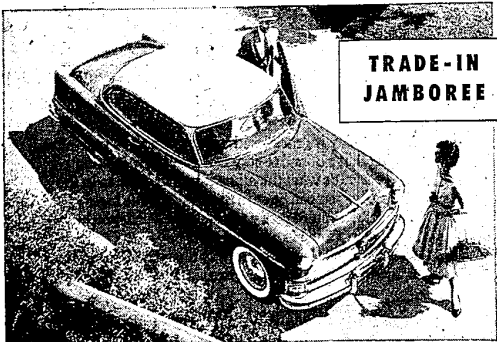

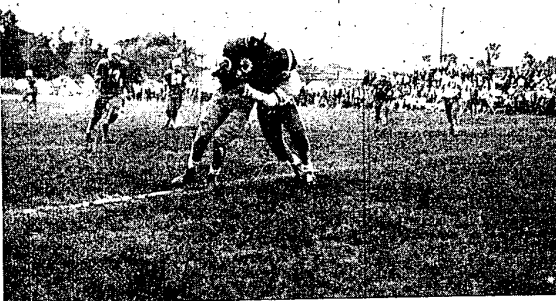

Fourth Period Ground Attack Gives Rochester 27-12 Win Over Falcons

A grinding fourth-quarter ground attack gave Rochester a 27-12 victory over the Farmington Falcons last Friday afternoon at the Farmington High School gridiron. Up until the final period the Falcons played the Rochester boys on even terms, and were trailing by only a slim two-point margin, 14-12, at the end of the third quarter.

The first half of the game was nip-and-tuck. Farmington scored first early in the opening quarter when Ron Donaghy grabbed a loose Rochester ball and scampered to pay dirt. His try for the conversion, however, was blocked.

Rochester came right back and pushed over a touchdown themselves. The extra point try was good and the Rochester eleven took the lead 7-6.

In the second quarter the Falcons scored their second touchdown. A 13-yard pass from half-back Bob Byrne to Bob Brewster connected and Brewster lugged the piskin over to score. Again the conversion try was unsuccessful.

Again Rochester bounced back to score in the same stanza, and with a plunge through the middle added their extra point for a 14-12 halftime lead.

Play saw-sawed back and forth in the third quarter with neither team able to score. Then, in the final period, Rochester broke loose for two touchdowns and one extra point, giving them the comfortable 27-12 victory.

During the game the Rochester eleven ground out 25 first downs good for 272 yards net gain. Farmington netted only 12 first downs and a total of 92 yards gain during the afternoon.

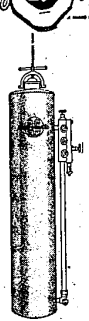
This Friday afternoon the Falcons will journey to Berkeley in hopes of avenging their two early defeats in as many starts. This will be the first conference tussle for the Falcons.

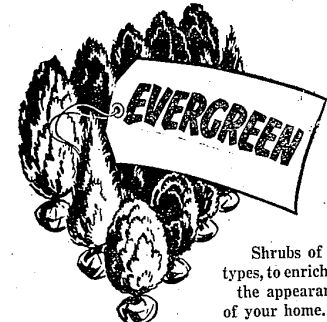
