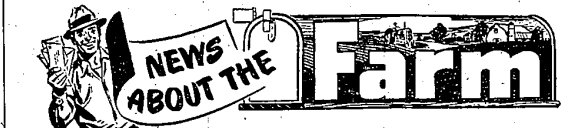

FARM EQUIPMENT TAKES STRAIN OFF FARMER'S WIFE

The farm wife may never operate a tractor or any other piece of farm equipment, and she may have no knowledge at all of what makes these mechanical marvels work. But, nonetheless, she owes a considerable debt to farm equipment.

The grain-threshing seasons of only a comparatively few years back provide a fine example. It took eight or a dozen men working from dawn to dusk to load the shocks on wagons and haul them to the threshing machine. Others men kept the machine running and hauled the grain away. Every one of these workers had a huge appetite that had to be satisfied three times a day — and the farm wife toiled early and late in a hot kitchen to provide the food.

Now one man, driving a modern machine, can do the whole job — and do it quickly, efficiently, economically, and with a minimum of human effort. The time the farm wife used to have to devote to preparing food of cooking is available for other duties or pleasures.

As every schoolboy is taught, the internal combustion engine totally revolutionized industry. And that engine, powering farm equipment, has revolutionized agriculture just as thoroughly. In colonial days, 55 farm workers could produce just enough food for themselves and 15 other people. Now that equation has been reversed. 15 farmers raised enough for themselves and 55 others. That means that vast armies of people are able to work in factories which produce cars, radios, kitchen appliances and so on — the thousand and one things that make life better for all of us.

AREA CATTLE WILL BE ENTERED IN BIG DAIRY SHOW

Entries of the continent's top purebred dairy cattle indicate an increased showing of all breeds at the Second International Dairy Show, to be held in the International Amphitheatre at the Chicago Stock Yards October 9 through 15, officials of the show report. Among cattle entered will be 21 purebred Ayrshires from the Windrow Farms in Birmingham. The farm is owned by Edward W. Williams.

Owners prize winning cattle from the Atlantic and Pacific coasts and Canada will exhibit their best animals in competition for \$6,500 in cash prizes that are offered in the competitions for the six breeds that produce the nation's milk — Ayrshires, Brown Swiss, Guernseys, Holsteins, Jerseys, and Milking Shorthorns.

The International Dairy Show, immediately following the National Dairy Cattle Congress in Waterloo, Iowa, will center attention of the nation's dairymen in the Midwest where these two national events will take place in consecutive weeks. It is under the management of the 54-year-old International Live Stock Exposition, world-famed annual show of the meat-making breeds of farm animals.

A special train will transport the cattle directly from the Iowa show to the International Amphitheatre in Chicago where they will meet in competition many Eastern and Canadian cattle.

New Plan For State Cattle Auctions To Be Tested At Hillsdale Sale

An innovation in Michigan cattle auctions that may serve as a pilot plan for the other 59 in the state will be introduced October 9 at Hillsdale as the result of an agreement between the Michigan Department of Agriculture and Andy Adams, owner of the Hillsdale Livestock Auction.

The plan, which was suggested by Mr. Adams, required legislative action. "It is expected to be of great aid to our Bang's disease program," according to G. S. McIntyre, director of the Department, whose Bureau of Animal Industry has charge of Bang's eradication.

Bang's disease, or brucellosis, is contagious abortion in cattle and results in loss of milk and meat to the herd owner. It is transmissible as an undulant fever to man, usually those tending cattle.

Under the Hillsdale Plan, any apparently healthy cattle not for slaughter and going to the sale will undergo Bang's testing immediately prior to the start of negotiations. A charge of \$2 will be paid by the consignor.

An accredited Hillsdale veterinarian, Dr. Charles H. Coy, who will be paid by the Michigan Department of Agriculture, will conduct the tests. Any reactor animals will be hot branded with a 2-inch "B" (for Bang's) on the left jaw. Dr. Coy will issue certificates and other documents of animals showing negative and will write slaughter permits for reactor animals.

Reacting animals will be released only for slaughter, and will be segregated so as not to infect other cattle. The veterinarian also will inspect premises for sanitation.

Animals not requiring the test.

Michigan Among Top Five Duck Hunting States

Duck stamp sales in Michigan for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1954, totaled 137,225, an all-time high, according to the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

Last year's figure was an increase of 919 stamps over the 1952-53 fiscal year when the previous record was established.

Nationally, Michigan placed fourth in duck stamp sales to continue its year-after-year position among the leaders. First place went to Texas with 230,391, California dropped to second place with 193,425 and Minnesota was third with 154,004. Wisconsin and Illinois trailed Michigan with 131,029 and 114,914, respectively. These were the only states where duck stamp sales exceeded 100,000.

Pick Farm Census Leaders, Canvass Begins October 19

C. L. McBride of Utica and Fred J. Beckman of Milford started training Monday in Detroit as crew leaders for the 1954 Census of Agriculture, to begin October 19 in this area and surrounding communities.

McBride will direct a force of enumerators canvassing all farms in the east one-third of Oakland County and the west one-third of Macomb County. Beckman will direct canvassers in the west two-thirds of Oakland County.

Following their one week's training as crew leaders, McBride and Beckman will return to their areas where they will spend three weeks recruiting enumerators, checking enumeration district boundaries and training workers for the start of the census.

It will be the responsibility of these two men to train enumerators and supervise their work, plan and allocate work assignments, review their work and take remedial action where necessary, and handle farms difficult to canvass.
