The big moment arrives for Private Albert J. Hanson, son of Frances Hanson of 28415 Greening Street, and Private Maurice E. Wallace, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Wallace of 28052 Orchard Lake Road, as they wait to board a plane for their fifth parachute jump. This is the jump that will qualify them as paratroopers. The two soldiers are shown above rigged out for the jump. They carry a parachute on their backs, reserve chute and combat pack in front and rifle in a canvas bag at their side. A C-47 aircraft, from which they will make their jumps, will be picking them up shortly. The fifth jump is the concluding phase of three weeks of intensive physical and technical advanced training qualifying paratrooper candidates for the post. The training is given by the 82nd Airborne Division at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. Hanson is a clerk-typist with H Company of the 504th Airborne Infantry Regiment and Wallace is a rifleman with L Company of the 504th Airborne. Both are a part of the famed 82nd Airborne Division.

Surviving besides his wife, Lulu, is one step-son, Gaylord Hanson of Wayne, Michigan, and two grandchildren.

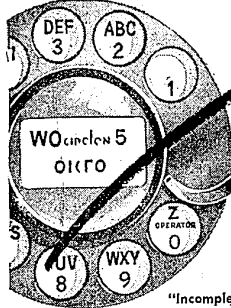
Pennsylvania had 13 counties last year in each of which bituminous coal production exceeded a million tons; Washington County occupying the honor spot.
