John Oliver and Dick Grimshaw were in the lead for the first half mile. Then Ponds from Walled Lake pushed out in front to hold a 25-yard lead on Dick Grimshaw. In the last half mile Grimshaw made a terrific 24 yard spring to beat Ponds by 25 yards.

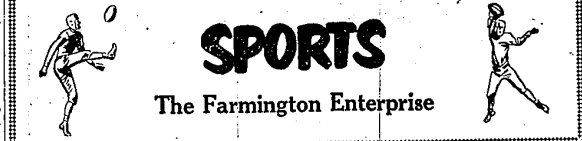
The Van Dyke club added another TD in the second quarter while the Falcons were unable to move.

Farmington held their own through most of the third period. Late in the quarter, however, Van Dyke uncorked a 50-yard toss beyond the Falcon defensive for another tally.

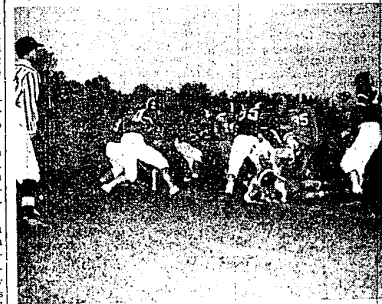
A Falcon fumble on their own one-foot line, recovered by Van Dyke, provided the final, unneeded touchdown in the last quarter.

This Friday afternoon the Falcons will take on Southfield in a Homecoming contest. They will be trying for their first victory.

State Park System Prepares For Winter

Michigan's state park system is getting ready for winter.

Park managers are busy storing summer equipment and closing down buildings and other facilities. Also, winter equipment is being readied for the flood of hunters, skiers and others who make use of the public lands available for these sports during cold months.

Closed Season Unchanged On Great Lakes Fishing

Closed seasons on lake trout, whitefish and chubs in Michigan waters of the Great Lakes remain unchanged this year, the conservation department's annual reminder to commercial fishermen points out.

Lake trout may not be taken from Lake Huron during the month of October; from Lake Superior October 5 to November 4; from Lake Michigan, November 5 to December 10; Lake Erie, December 1 to March 10.

For chubs, the closed seasons are the entire month of November in Lakes Huron, Michigan and Superior.

The department emphasizes that no permits will be issued to anyone to fish for spawners during the closed seasons.

No Forest Fires Listed In State During Week

No forest fires were reported to the state conservation department last week.

To date this year, 532 reported fires have burned about 3600 acres. This total is well below the pace set during the record year of 1951 when an all-time low of only 4491 acres were burned.

General rains over the state reduced the fire hazard last week. It was the first perfect week since the fire season started in the spring.

The reports cover all lands in Michigan, public and private, except federal forest acreage.

SMALL GAME, DEER EXPECTED TO LURE RECORD NUMBER

Michigan's forthcoming hunting seasons on small game and deer are expected to attract a record number of sportsmen to the state's woods and waters, reports the conservation department.

An estimated 750,000 residents of Michigan will hunt small game during the season which gets under way in the upper and northern lower peninsulas on October 1.

The bulk of these hunters will not take to the field, however, until the opening of the general pheasant season on October 20.

Nonresident small game hunters may number about 5000 this year, state workers estimate.

October 1 also marks the opening of the bow and arrow season on deer and department estimates for this season are 30,000 resident and 3000 non-resident archers.

A predicted 455,000 residents will hunt during this year's first arm deer season which opens November 15, with 30,000 non-resident deer hunters also expected.

Fishermen Gain Access To Another State Lake

Michigan fishermen gained access to another lake this month when the conservation commission authorized purchase of a fishing site on Big Bass Lake in Otsego County.

To date, anglers have obtained access to about 600 lakes and streams in the state under the public fishing site program.

In addition, the commission approved purchase of 569 acres of game lands in six state game areas under the Pittman-Robertson program. Forty acres of land in southeastern Michigan's Orionville project and 10 planted lots in Higgins Lake state park also were authorized for purchase.
