MUSKIE PROJECT FAILS; TO TRY AGAIN NEXT YEAR

The project aimed at growing more muskies for Michigan lakes drew a blank this year, but state fisheries workers say next year will be better equipped and better able to handle the task.
State workers, aided by Wisconsin conservationists, live-trapped upper peninsula lakes early this spring. From these, they "stripped" 400,000 eggs.
But the eggs were damaged by bad weather during shipment so only a handful hatched and workers later reported none of these survived the critical early-growing period.
However, during the same fish rapping work, some northern pike eggs were collected and after a fairly successful hatchery period, about 5,000 fingerling-sized fish were experimentally planted in a number of state lakes.
Next spring, state workers will be busy live-trapping fish again with muskellunge the main objective. Ten big box-shaped nets were ordered recently and knowledge gained from the 1954 attempt will guide future work.
"We have to fight several problems unique to Michigan," says A. B. Cook, "but we hope to get more muskies next spring. In any case, the work will continue until we get some results."

The first section of the giant cool-toil plant near Johannesburg, South Africa, has begun operations, and other sections of the \$84 million project soon will be operative. When complete, the plant will produce about 55 million gallons of gasoline annually, plus 4 1/2 million gallons of diesel oil, and more than one million gallons of fuel oil, in addition to countless chemical by-products. 2-1c

MANY BIRDS WILL STAY FOR WINTER IF PROVIDED FOOD

Birds are among the few savants of summer that can be persuaded to linger throughout winter.
Food is the lure. Many varieties of birds mind the cold scarcely at all, but are forced to migrate to warmer climes in search of the insects, seed plants and berries which make up their diets.
Householders who provide the proper foods consistently from October until spring can expect a constant parade of common and rare species, some left from the summer season and others from their more northern haunts.
Foods placed at feeding stations need not be expensive or of great variety, according to a Cranbrook Institute of Science report. Ordinary baby-chick scratch feed, mixed with small sunflower seed in a ratio of ten to one, is a good basic food.
Suet is a fair favorite, though they are happy to get peanut butter, raisins, various fresh fruits, waste lettuce, bread crumbs and raw, unspiced peanuts.
While simple shelves placed at a window are satisfactory lunch counters for birds if kept free of snow, more elaborate roosting feeding stations can be bought at local supply stores, or easily made.
Some persons provide water which many birds drink in preference to eating snow. The water can be kept warm in freezing weather by placing a light bulb below the container.
It is urged, however, that once a feeding station is started, it should be kept stocked until warm weather, since birds grow to depend on it and may perish when food is not available elsewhere.

State Folder Offers Tips For Deer Hunters

The annual deer hunting information folder is now available to hunters, the conservation department reports.
Information from last year's seasons that game workers feel will be helpful to hunters this year is included in the folder, along with an explanation of 1954 season regulations.
Small maps show location of last year's hunting activity by area and indicate the kill per square mile for each area.
"You may interpret this information to your best advantage," states an open letter to deer hunters on the face page of the folder, "and it is provided purposely to help you with your hunting plans this fall."
The open letter also sums up what happened during Michigan's 1953 and 1954 special deer seasons in the lower peninsula.
The popular folders may be obtained upon request from the conservation department's game division at Lansing 26, Michigan.
