COUNTY BLOOD COLLECTIONS HIGH DURING SEPTEMBER

Oakland County had better brace itself for some congratulations... Bloodwise.

According to Dr. Ernest Bauer, chairman of the blood committee for the county, reports that Oakland has exceeded its September quota by 100 points.

Oakland is second in the Detroit Region, which includes Michigan, St. Clair, Oakland, Washtenaw and Wayne Counties.

Dr. Bauer's report states that a total of 838 pints was collected by 5 mobiles averaging over ten pints per mobile above quota.

Oakland County patients hospitalized in and out of the county used 53 pints and 1 pint were sent to the defense department.

Wayne County was on top in collection with 4,553 pints for 27 mobiles. Macomb was third with 111 pints, however 291 pints were used by the county itself.

A surplus for Oakland County is especially good at this time. Dr. Bauer has reported, because it will enable the repayment of the blood debt to the other counties in the region which was contracted during July and August.

Eleven mobiles are scheduled for October, and Mrs. Dilton Sifton of Birmingham, mobile recruitment chairman, says that this month's quota can be exceeded too.

She says that the county will probably go over its goal until January, when full scale recruitment will be necessary to get enough in the months following.

ton where they held continuous until the time of her death.

Always interested in community affairs, Mrs. McCracken was a member of the Farmington Methodist Church as well as many other organizations. She was especially active during World War I. When the influenza epidemic moved through the area in 1918, Mrs. McCracken worked for weeks almost without rest nursing the stricken families of her friends and neighbors.

She leaves besides her husband, three sons, Howard W. and Donald E. of Farmington and Harold of Detroit. Surviving also is a sister, Mrs. George W. Morrison, and a brother, Daniel Ross McKenney, both of Vancouver, British Columbia. Four brothers preceded her in death, including John K. McKenney, who was a pioneer citizen of Vancouver and who founded the B. C. Marine Engineering and Shipbuilders, Ltd., and the McKenney Barge and Derrick Co., Ltd.

Throughout her married life, Mrs. McCracken assisted her husband in the management of their 80-acre farm in Farmington, which has been in continuous operation during their 52 years of marriage.
