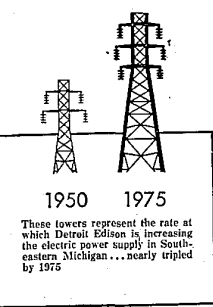
The winners will be crowned December 2 at the Coronation Ball. Their honorary duties will include reviewing the Army parades.

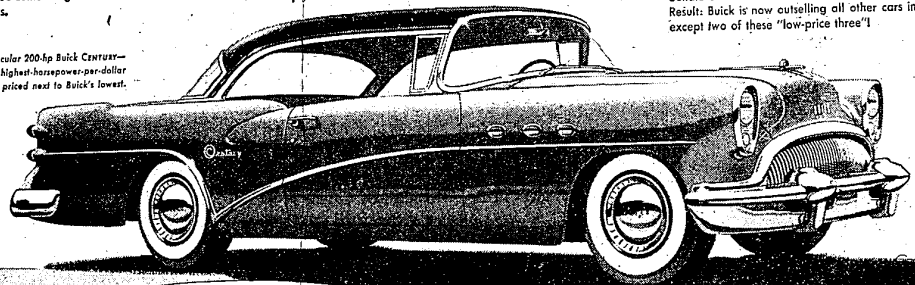
