The Dodrill-GMR heart has two sides, one substituting for the right side of the human heart and the other for the left. During surgery either one or both sides of the mechanical device may be connected with the patient's circularry system.

As the mechanical device is turned on, the human heart continues to beat and, pump itself dry. Normat circulation is taken over by the mechanical heart.

Positive and negative air pressures are alternately applied to the inside of the finger cot, causing it to expand and collapse When a cot collapses, blood from

When a cot collapses, blood from the patient's system enters through the inlet valve and fills the glass cylinder.

When the cot expands, blood flows through the outlet valve into the patient's system. The medical-engineering team found this type of pumping action may be made to approximate the human heart's action. However, this mechanical nettion does not admage the blood.

Damage to blood cells was one of the major hazards that had to be overcome in the mechanical design of the device.

sign of the device.

All parts of the mechanical heart that come in contact with the blood can be easily disassembled and sterilized in an ordinary autocave to prevent possibility of infection. Exhaustive clinical tests have shown there is no danger of infection when routine pre-

autions are taken.

The device itself is portable—
approximately 10 inches long, 12
nches wide, and 14 inches high.
