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36 DAYS TO CHRISTMAS

TEEN-AGE HUNTERS MOST DANGEROUS GROUP IN FIELD

Teen-age hunters are well on their way again, this year to being the most dangerous group in the field.

To date in Michigan's month-old hunting season, five youngsters have been killed and 19 wounded. In comparison, four adults have been killed and 19 wounded.

Most of these accidents have been self-inflicted wounds or inflicted by other members of the hunter's party.

No person under 17 years of age may purchase a hunting license without written approval of parent or guardian, but this year about 100,000 youngsters have received such approval.

Parents who sign affidavits allowing their children to buy and use hunting licenses have a legal responsibility to see that an older person always hunts with the youngster.

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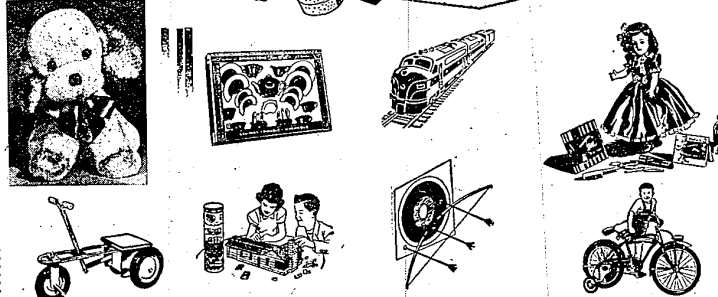
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
