3 Seminars

To Explain

Michigan's new land sales act, which is designed to reduce deceptive practices in land sales in the state, will be explained in seminars sponsored by the Institute of Continuing Legal Education (ICLE).

Three separate seminars will be held June 15-16 at the Rackham Building in Detroit, June 22-23 at the Park Place Motor Inn in Traverse City, and July 13-14 at the Clds Plaza in Lansing. ICLE is a non-profit unit of the University of Michigan and Wayne State University law schools and the state bar of Michigan.

The new law, which takes effect on Oct. 1, will closely monitor the disposition of land parcels in Michigan and will provide a mechanism to reduce fraud and misrepresentation.

Among those liable under the new act are attorneys, developers, banks, realtors, insurance companies, news-papers, and television and radio stations.
