New 1955 Plymouths Now On Display, Feature Bigger, More Powerful Auto

Plymouth's bigger and more powerful 1955 model cars are now on display in Farmington and throughout the nation.

The 1955 Plymouths are entirely new, both in styling and engineering detail. They are lower, longer and wider than previous Plymouth cars.

The 1955 engines are a 117-horsepower Power-Flite, a 157-horsepower Hy-Fire V-8 and a 167-horsepower Hy-Fire V-8. The latter engine is also available with a four-barrel carburetor and special manifold which increases its horsepower to 177.

Plymouth offers as optional equipment a full range of automatic and power assist devices. They include Power-Flite fully automatic no clutch transmission, a new design coaxial full-time power steering, power brakes, power-actuated front seat adjustment, a power-operated window regulator, and adjustable speed electric windshield wipers. Air conditioning by Airtemp is available as special equipment.

The 1955 line is made up of 12 models, including for the first time four-door versions of the Plymouth Suburban, the all steel body "station wagon" type car which Plymouth pioneered in '49.

Among the distinctive features of Plymouth's new styling are a new silhouette, slimmer and sleeker lines, deeply recessed head lights and tail lights, and an overall appearance of forward motion.

Plymouth four-door sedans are 10.3 inches longer than their predecessors. They are 1.7 inches lower. Front seats are 3.3 inches wider and rear seats 5.3 inches wider.

A new Full-View wrap-around windshield, with swept back corner posts, at top and bottom, has 16 per cent more glass area. It is contoured to eliminate distortion.

The new models have push button door handles. The fuel filler pipe has been moved from the rear to the right side of the car, with an attractive hinged door on the rear right panel. The filler pipe occupies unused space behind the spare tire. The trunk compartment has 33.8 cubic feet of useful space.

The color styling and fabrics of 1955 models are new. The 14 new exterior colors in the new models were chosen in a series of eliminations which started with 90 different colors.

All Plymouth cars, including the lowest priced, are color-styled throughout. Two-tone body color combinations are standard on the Belvedere models.

More than 60 different fabrics, carpets and soft trim materials are used in 23 interior trim combinations. Many of the fabrics feature lustrous metallic thread, an attractive innovation in automobile upholstery.

One of the novel features of the interior is the design of the instrument panel, which reflects

Tickets for the program will be on sale at the door of the high school auditorium Saturday evening. The tour is scheduled to begin at 8:30 p.m.

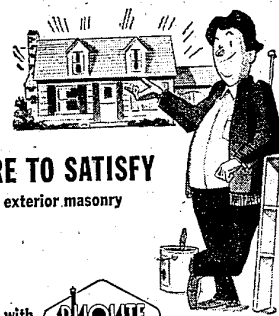

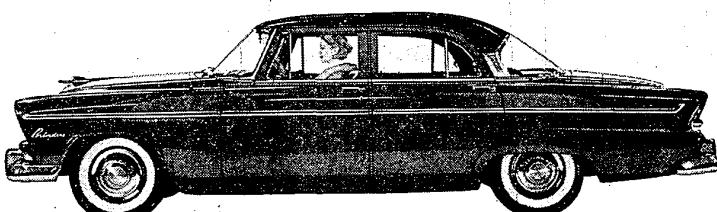
LAST CALL - -
