COLLAPSED MERINGUES?

Do meringues on your pies always fall rather than stand up stiff and light? Be sure to use 2 tablespoons of sugar per egg white and allow 2 egg whites for a 9-inch pie or 3 whites for a 5-inch pie. The filling should be cool before topping with the meringue to the edge of the crust to prevent shrinkage. If a meringue is baked too quickly in a hot oven, it will collapse because its center is not baked. Bake meringues in a moderately slow oven (325 degrees) for about 20 minutes.

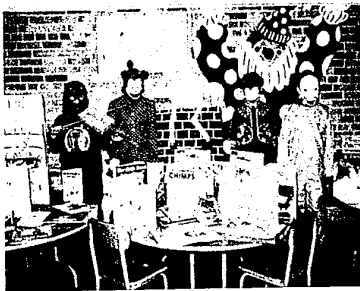
Mrs. Ada Bollinger is reported ill. She is presently staying at the home of her sister in Lansing.

HOLIDAY OPEN HOUSE

Book Fairs were held at all Clarencville elementary schools last Thursday and Friday, November 18 and 19, in conjunction with the P. T. A.-sponsored open house Tuesday evening, November 16.

From 7:00 to 8:00 p.m., parents and teachers had an opportunity to become better acquainted. Some parents also watched students of Mr. Glenn's department making jewelry, Christmas block printing, Christmas wrappings, etc.

The evening program started at 8:00 p.m. in the cafeteria. Under the direction of Mr. William Pouch, the mixed chorus and the Falconnaires sang a variety of numbers. Solo parts were sung by Diane Franje and Roberta Spaller. Inspired by the chorus, the audience joined in "Alma Mater."

Guest speaker Robert Lewis, consultant in Traffic Safety for the Automobile Club of Michigan, discussed safe driving. "Good safety habits," he said, "tend to follow through life and conversely, those with poor safety habits do not improve much. Statistics show that whereas five years ago the rate of traffic accidents was 13 to 23, the group now holding that questionable distinction is the 21 to 25 group."

"Safety habits should be taught early in the home and starting in the kindergarten in school. Actually, children can learn safety habits in the handling of their scooters, tricycles and bicycles and from observing parents who practice good safety habits."

Mr. Lewis pointed out that education seems to be the only hope of reducing the appalling amount of suffering and death due to accidents in the home and at work as well as on the road.

"It is also interesting to note," continued Mr. Lewis, "that side roads can be dangerous too. During a period in which 60 deaths due to traffic accidents occurred in Genesee County, only 13 were in Flint."

A film on driving illustrated that the capable, safe driver is constantly appraising the traffic situation in an effort to be prepared for any emergency. Patience, consideration and courtesy are attributes of all good drivers.

Pumpkin pie and coffee served by the ninth grade mothers brought the evening to a close.
