Mrs. Grace was born in Farmington Township March 16, 1896, the daughter of William and Mary Irish Adams. She attended the Farmington Public Schools and graduated from the State Normal College at Ypsilanti. Mrs. Grace taught in the West Farmington and Fowlerville Schools and then at Burt School in Detroit from 1912 to 1914, after retirement in 1914.

She was united in marriage to Clarence J. Grace in Farmington on January 1, 1914. Mrs. Grace was a member of the Farmington Methodist Church, the Farmington W. C. S. S., the Farmington Garden Club, the Three Flags Chapter of the D. A. R., and was member of the Farmington Library Board.
