The Clare Lockwoods, Floyd Darlings, L. J. Putnams and William Rackors returned home Sunday from a four day hunting expedition near Lewiston.

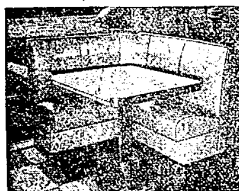
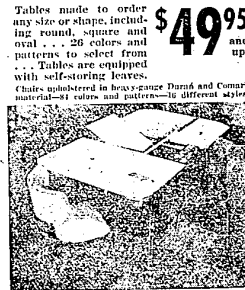
Mrs. Frank Clark and L. Davidson are now confined to Sessions Hospital in Northville.

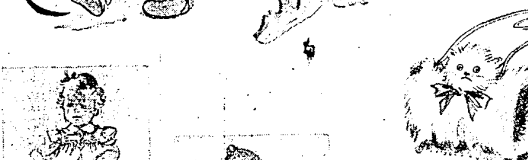

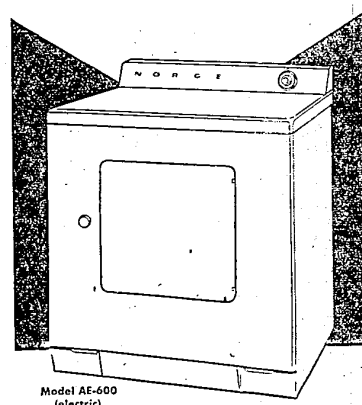
