## Falcons Chalk Up Conference Win Over Walled Lake Quintet Friday

The Falcons overcame their first league game of the season Friday by trouncing the Walled Lake Vikings 56-42. The win boosted Farmington's season standing to three wins and two losses. It also moved Farmington into a four-way tie for second place with Walled Lake, Berkeley, and Southfield.

The Falcon quintet pulled from behind in the first period, squeezed ahead of the Vikings in the second period, and led by six points at the half, 23-17. From that time on the Vikings were never a real threat to the rampaging Falcons.

Forcing play the whole way, the Falcons compelled the Vikings to play a defensive game. At the end of the third period the score was 35-25.

Bud Jones, who racked up 18 points in his triumphant team, was his savior. Jones made 10 of his points by sinking ten out of eleven free shots, the last ten consecutively.

He was followed closely by Bruce Shonkist, who made 14 points, 12 of them on field goals.

Ron Donaghy racked up 12 points on five field goals and two free shots. Donaghy, who started the season slowly, has apparently pulled out of his slump and has been, for the past three games, a top notch Falcon scorer.

Jerry Rice made seven points and played a very excellent defensive game, as did Don Nichols.

## TO PRODUCE OVER 4 MILLION TROUT EGGS BEFORE JAN. 1

State conservation department workers will process 4,125,000 trout eggs before the end of this year, Michigan's entire collection for 1954.

Brood stock at Harrietta hatchery provided 2,500,000 rainbow eggs. Stripping operations were completed last week and the eggs are expected to hatch sometime in February.

The U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service provided the supply of 425,000 brown trout eggs from its Cortland, New York, hatchery. The Service provides the eggs free, the state paying only express and handling charges.

Brook trout eggs - 1,200,000 of them - will be shipped in from hatcheries outside the state, probably during the last week of the year. The cheapest way to obtain the eggs is from these outside hatcheries.

These fish will constitute the bulk of 1955 plantings. They will be fingerlings in the summer of 1955 and legal in 1956.
