Air Spotters To Keep 24-Hour Vigil On Christmas Day

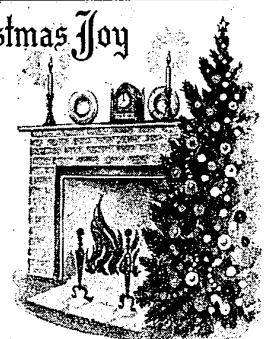
