**Drinking, Driving Will Never Mix, Doctor Proves**

Drinking alcoholic liquor while driving will make you a top prospect for ending up in the emergency room of a hospital, according to Dr. G. W. Muehlberger, director of the Crime Detection Laboratory of the Michigan Department of Health.  
Studies show that persons even in the very early stages of intoxication increase their chances of becoming a casualty. With the low blood alcohol concentration of .06 per cent the drinker has three times as good a chance of ending up in a hospital as the sober driver. But this fellow who really works at it and gets his blood alcohol level up to .15 per cent skyrockets his chances to 55 times that of the person who has not been drinking.  
"It's easy to see," said Dr. Muehlberger, "that a person who has had alcoholic liquor to drink is simply not capable of the fast thinking and quick action required on our highways today."  
Dr. Muehlberger emphasized that alcohol is really an anesthetic and in addition, to slowing a person's reaction time, narrows his visual field. In this condition a driver is unable to see as far to either side as he normally could. And with his slowed reaction time he is unable to adjust to unexpected situations fast enough.  
"With the high horsepower of today's automobiles it just doesn't pay to mix gasoline and alcohol," Muehlberger said. "If you've had any intoxicating drink, make sure that you confine your driving to being a passenger."
