FIGURES ON PUBLIC SCHOOL FINANCING

The Citizens Research Council f-Michigan recently came up with ome interesting figures regard-ng public school financing in

ing public school (financing in Michigan. Figures revenled that while average daily membership had increased 26 per cent. total reviews (for operation, construction and 'debt retirement) rose 521 per cent. From \$123 million to \$466 million. This represents an increase per pupil of 203 per cent from \$122 to \$399. General operating revenues increased a quarter of a billion doi: 10.00 million, or 21f per cent. On a million, or 21f per cent. On a per pupil basis this is an increase from \$114 to; \$251 or 147 per cent.

Local property tax collections rose \$50 inilition or 130 per cent. Or a per-pupil basis this is an \$83 per cent increase. State fundalineressed from \$40 million to \$117 million or \$24 per-cent per pupil.
