stances of about 600 feet south from Orchard Street.

New sewer installations will cost an estimated \$72,000. They will include a 24-inch storm sewer from Shawwassee west of Lakeway to the river for a distance of 1,500 feet, as well as a 10-inch sanitary sewer parallel to the west side of Lakeway, and a 10-inch sewer on the east side of Lakeway replacing an existing sewer. A 12-inch combination sewer is also proposed along Farmington Road from Orchard to Slocum and a 10-inch sewer at the rear of the lots on the north side of Shawwassee for a distance of 300 feet west of Prospect. The issue will also cover the cost of a sanitary sewer from Shawwassee to the river, which has already been installed, plus a storm sewer from a point 600 feet north of Shawwassee on Prospect to the river south of Valley View.

It is estimated that the total cost of engineering, legal, financial and administrative will run approximately \$10,000. The issue would be on a revenue bond basis spread over a period of 29 years.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING ON CHANGES IN GOVING ORDINANCE

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the City of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, will meet in the City of Farmington on Saturday, April 23, 1955, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon to consider amendments and changes to the boundaries of certain Districts and Zones in the City, but such proposed changes are as follows:

I. The following Districts and Boundaries shall be designated as "COMMERCIAL" ZONES:

A. So called parcel B or that area lying north of a line 130 feet north of and approximately parallel to Slocum, east of a line running north from a point approximately 50 feet west of the west line of Frederick and extending approximately to the rear line of lots fronting on the southerly side of Grand River west of Mayfield, and southwesterly of said lots.

B. So called parcel A or that area lying north of Slocum east of and fronting on Farmington Road, south of rear line of lot fronting on the southerly line of Orchard Street, and west of a line approximately 490 feet east of rear line of Farmington Road.

C. Parcel of land otherwise known as Old Elementary School of Our Lady of Sorrows Parish lying west of the westerly line of Mooney, north of and fronting on Grand River Avenue, east of the easterly boundary of Brookdale Subdivision, Lots 92 and 93, and south of a line formed by the intersection of the north line of Lot 93 Brookdale Subdivision as extended to Mooney.

II. The following District and Boundaries shall be designated as "LIGHT INDUSTRIAL" Zones:

Parcel of land lying south of Grand River Cut-Off, east of Farmington Road and north of Nine Mile Road.

III. The following District and Boundaries shall be designated as a "GENERAL INDUSTRIAL" Zone: Parcel of land lying west of Farmington Road, south of Grand River Cut-Off, east of Gill Road and North of Nine Mile Road. Dated: March 28, 1955
