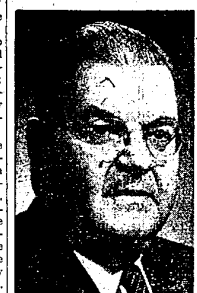

### Methodist Bishop To Dedicate New Rooms At Church

Bishop Marshall R. Reed, Episcopal head of the Methodist Church in Michigan, will preach the dedication sermon and dedicate the new educational unit at the Clarenceville Methodist Church, Grand River and Collingham, at 3 p. m. Sunday, June 5.

Assisting the Bishop will be Dr. Benjamin F. Holme, D. D., Superintendent of the Detroit District; Dr. Gordon Phillips, executive secretary of the Michigan District; Greater Detroit; and the minister of the church, Rev. Elsie A. Johns.

Work on the building, started in September of last year, is now completed. The building cost \$10,000 and will be dedicated free of debt. It consists of a large recreation room, several class rooms, departmental rooms, church offices, and a pastor's study.

The present pastor of the church came to Clarenceville in 1941, when the church had no membership. The membership is now 691. A Sunday School meets every Sunday throughout the year. Clarenceville Methodist has one of the largest Daily Vacation Church Schools in the Detroit District. Organizations within the church include a Methodist Men's Club, two Youth Fellowship groups, a Women's Society of Christian Service, and four choirs. Under the leadership of Mrs. Paul Arensman, organist and director.

Two morning services are held each Sunday, the first at 8:45 and the second at 11:15 a. m. A Sunday evening service and a Wednesday evening prayer meeting are held at 7:30.

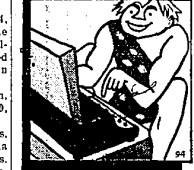
