Following a church supper, they showed slides of the work done in teaching new agricultural methods of the Mexicans and of the new school Mrs. Woods opened for the children of the farmers.

Originally from the Kalamazoo area, the Woods have spent five years in their mission assignment and will return to Mexico late in July.

For the past year they have been living in East Lansing while Woods worked on an advanced degree in communications at Michigan State University.

Father And Son Study Together

A Livonia father and son, Charles and David Hoff, were among 20 families from Livonia and Farmington who participated in a Jehovah's Witnesses two-day teaching session in Detroit recently.

Some 900 Jehovah's Witnesses from the Detroit area attended the meetings.

David handled one of the program parts and gave a seven-minute talk on missionary work in the Argentine in the model ministry school.

The program was titled "Using Our Bible - Trained Conscience to Make Right Decisions."

David commented: "Some people my age, I guess of practically any age, seem to feel that learning about divine law and principles and trying to live by them would restrict their personal freedom."

"But I believe that if I'm going to make wise decisions in life, it only makes sense to tune my conscience to Christian principles."

"These principles are a safeguard, but also allow great personal freedom with reasonable boundaries. And, as my dad says, 'The horizon of benefits is endless.'"

Reviewing another part of the program, Charles Hoff observed: "It's so easy to think we don't need personal direction from anyone outside ourselves. But I liked the proverb quoted by one of the speakers, 'Before a crash, the heart of a man is lofty, and before glory, there is humility.' To place overconfidence in yourself, whether you are a parent or a teenager, would be inviting disappointment, or a crash."

"A lot of today's problems can be so much easier to handle when approached with a mild, tempered attitude."

"For example, a family functions more smoothly when each person's ideas are given sincere thought. I really enjoy doing things with my children, whether it be some form of sports or something more serious, such as the convention we are all attending together."

Other members of the family are Mrs. Dorothea Hoff, Danny, 13; Chuckie, 6; and Luwella, 5.

Both Hoff and his son are enrolled in the weekly ministry school sponsored by the Farmington Congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses.

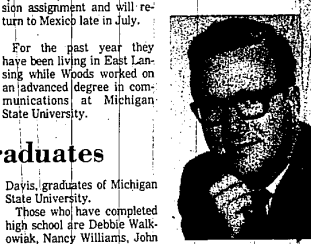
