

# Safety Poster Contest Has 2 Local Winners

FARMINGTON Young Farmington artists were among the 14 top winners in the 29th annual AAA school traffic safety poster contest.

Jane MacLaren, 14, of 33399 Colony Park Dr. and Laraine Mocerri, 14, of 28261 Greencastle, both took third place. Each received a \$25 savings bond. Both are students at Our Lady of Mercy High School.

Bond awards were presented to the winners by Arthur C. Gibson, manager of the Automobile Club of Michigan's Safety and Traffic Engineering Dept., at a luncheon at Northland Center this month. Parents and teachers attended the presentation.

"We can be justifiably proud of these young people," Gibson said, noting that all but three of Michigan's 17 poster contest winners were from the Detroit area.

He said that of the 39,838 posters submitted from

schools across the U.S. and Canada, only 132 were selected for savings bond awards.

Top honors at the Southfield luncheon went to Troy Garrett, 11, of Detroit. He received a \$150 reproduction award for his first-place poster titled, "Walk on Left Facing Traffic."

"The Auto Club feels that involvement of school children in such programs as the traffic poster safety contest and in safety patrol work pays off," Gibson said and added, "In 1919, the year safety patrols began in Michigan, there were 300 traffic fatalities among school-age children. By last year, statewide fatalities among school-age children dropped to 79."

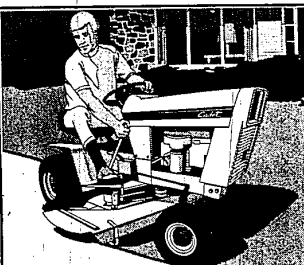
