**Blue Star Mothers  
To Sell Daisies  
Sept. 30 And Oct. 1**

Farmington Blue Star Mothers will join with other Blue Star Mothers across the state on September 30 and October 1 in the observance of Blue Star Mothers Daisy Day. Daisies will be sold on the streets in the area on those two days.

All proceeds from the sale of daisies will be used for charitable work in aiding veterans and their families.

The two days have been set aside throughout the state for the sale of daisies. The following is the Governor's proclamation to that effect:

**PROCLAMATION**

"One of the great forces for the improvement of veterans affairs in the United States has been the activity of the Blue Star Mothers of America, an organization whose members have sons or daughters in the armed forces of the United States.

"Outstanding among the many activities of this national group is the assistance they render to veterans in need of special care. In our own great state of Michigan Department of Blue Star Mothers maintain a rehabilitation foundation for veterans without charge.

"Other worthy projects of the Blue Star Mothers is supported by the annual public sale of blue daisies on a day assigned for such purpose. This year September 30 - October 1 has been designated as Blue Star Mothers Daisy Day.

"Therefore, I, G. Mennen Williams, Governor of the State of Michigan, do hereby proclaim Friday and Saturday, September 30 and October 1, 1955, as BLUE STAR MOTHERS DAISY DAY

in Michigan, and urge all our people on this day to aid the great program of the Blue Star Mothers of America by purchasing the blue daisy and thereby give this group the financial support they so richly deserve.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the State of Michigan, this second day of August, in the Year of Our Lord, One Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty-Five, and of the Commonwealth the One Hundred Nineteenth.
