Trout Named To Academy

FARMINGTON Theodore M. Trout, son of Lt. and Mrs. George Trout of Farmington, has been accepted by the U.S. Air Force Academy and will leave July 2 for Colorado Springs. He presently is a student at Virginia Military Institute. Trout, whose parents live at 3660 Brittany Hill Drive, is active in the Walled Lake Civil Air Patrol Squadron. He holds the rank of cadet captain and is eligible for cadet major. He has been awarded the Erhart and Mitchell awards and is well on his way to earning a student pilot license.

10 Mile Sewer Is Under Way

FARMINGTON The proposed 10 mile arm sewer, which will serve Quakertown and the northwest section of Farmington Township, was given a nudge toward construction Monday. The township board approved in principle a plan to accept advance tap fees from a developer to be used as "seed money" to help finance the project. Final costs are estimated at approximately \$3.5 million, a price approved by the board. The sewer will run up Farmington Road, cut west along 11 Mile and then follow the route of the Rouge River northwest. The developer, Pullie Home Corp., plans to develop approximately 320 acres of land at 12 Mile and Drake Roads. The development, which still lacks zoning approval, would need about 900 houses, costing between \$90,000 and \$1 million. They are asking for a planned residential development in the area.

Jaycees Elect New Officers

At a planning session, the Jaycees discussed a full year's program of more than 60 projects. The group decided to sponsor a rodeo during the Farmington Founders Festival, one of the largest projects the group has ever undertaken. The Jaycees also agreed to conduct a "walk for Alan kind" in the fall with all proceeds going to local recipients who serve the entire community. Youth assistance projects considered included a link meet and the annual 6th Miss Pageant. Community projects include assisting Living Opportunities Nursing Home, Goodfellows and a prayer breakfast for local leaders. Also planned was assistance to the Community Center, Rap Line and Y.
