(Continued from Page 1A) He became actively engaged in farming on the ancestral homestead in 1902 and has maintained his interest ever since. However, he still found time to serve two terms in the State Legislature in 1904 and 1906 besides being the first Agricultural Agent in Oakland County. During his long period of public service he also served as Township Supervisor, Justice of the Peace and Township Clerk. He was appointed to his present position of Clerk in 1935 and has served continuously in this office for the past 20 years.

McCracken, who passed his 90th birthday in July of 1955, has one of the longest records of public service of any official in the state. Efforts are now being made by the Township Board to secure a replacement to fill the vacancy.

Mrs. William Richert of Shadyridge had neighbors in last week for a brunch. The children who came along had an enjoyable time playing together.

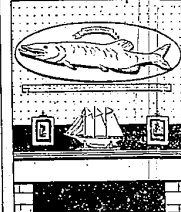
Mr. and Mrs. Gilbert Mack are flying to Florida for their vacation. They expect to be away for about a month.

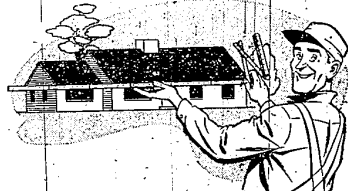
