Green Thumb

If the soil where you want to grow delphiniums is light, or even of medium fertility, work in plenty of well-decayed manure. If the soil is heavy work in sand, some sub soil, and a generous amount of compost or well-rotted manure.

The plants show to best advantage if three or more are grouped close together to make a sizable clump. However, allow about 18 inches or two feet between the plants. In a long border the clumps can be repeated at Intervals to create a rhythm and pattern in the garden.

SYCAMORE ANTHRACNOSE

Sycamore Anthracnose, a fungus leaf and twig disease, is severe this year due to low temperatures (55°F and below) at the time of bud initiation.

Leaves wilt, often causing the complete loss of the first set of leaves. Leaves appear to be killed by Strost, but it is the disease. The bottom one-third to one-half of the tree is most severely affected. New leaves will reappear on affected trees within 10 days or less. Twigs and small branches will be killed back and small cankers will appear at the base of the twigs.

Powdery mildew is often associated with the anthracnose in early summer.

When leaves are fully developed another phase of the disease appears, causing triangular brown areas in the leaves which eventually cause browning and death of the entire leaf. Infected leaves fail through the summer.

CONTROL: Spray as leaf buds swell in the spring of the year with two tablespoons of Benlate 50 per cent WP per gallon of water. Sprays should have started just as the leaf buds begin to swell. Sprays at this time will not be beneficial in reduction of the disease.

... Fertilization through root feeding will help the tree to make a more rapid recovery. Well fed trees also are the least affected by the disease the follow-
