Most programs start the week of June 25 and several sessions will be offered throughout the summer.

Enrollment is limited for the sake of quality and early registration is encouraged, said Community Program Director Fred Lindholm.

Using private heated pools throughout the area, the Y will have swimming classes for beginners, intermediate, advanced and junior and senior lifesaving.

More than 40 classes are scheduled through the summer. "Classes are scheduled for 10 hours, Monday through Friday, with eight hours guaranteed," Lindholm said. Classes will be taught by

Carlyn Bridges, YMCA specialist instructor.

Again using the backyard concept, the Y will offer 25 tennis classes this summer.

The classes are for elementary age students to adult with beginning, intermediate and advanced instruction. The Y will offer 10 hours of instruction with eight hours guaranteed. Classes will have a maximum enrollment of 12.

Instructors will be Rick So-lar, senior in physical education at Wayne State University, and Pat Paulin, a physical education teacher.

Robert Esler, PGA pro, will teach beginning golf classes for two weeks beginning June 25. The program will be on a Monday, Tuesday, Friday basis at Top of the Tee Golf range, 14 Mile and Orchard Lake roads.

Classes for ages eight to 12 will be from 1 to 2 p.m. and ages 13 and older from 2 to 3 p.m.

A mini-modeling course for the junior high school girl will be on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 7 to 9 p.m. starting June 26. Eight lessons will give information on poise and posture, make-up application, fashion coordination, etiquette and other advice.

Teen driver education will be available in two three-week sessions, beginning June 26 and July 16. The state certified class will offer 30 hours of classroom instruction every day from 10 a.m. to noon.

Participants also will receive six hours of behind the wheel instruction. In addition, the Y will sponsor an adult driver education class.

The YMCA gymnastic program will be conducted at the Mary Center facilities on Saturdays. The six week program will begin June 23.

Beginning gymnastics for boys and girls seven to 12 years old will be at 9 a.m. Children's gymnastics for boys and girls aged four to six will be from 10 to 11 a.m.

An intermediate and advanced class for girls aged eight to 16 will run from 10 to 11 a.m. A tryout for the championship YMCA gymnastic team will be held on June 23 at 11 a.m.

Participants will be given a prize at a party for all participants in the summer program.

Summer Reading Program Begins

FARMINGTON Registrations for the summer reading program are being held at the Farmington libraries at 23333 Farmington Road and at 32737 W. 12 Mile in Farmington Township.

Children who are entering grades four to seven are eligible for the program. They must read one book to register.

Entitled "Travel the USA the Tall Tale Way," the program is based on books about journeys across the country and locations where folk heroes lived.

FARC Summer Program Starts

FARMINGTON The summer program of the Farmington Area Recreation Commission will begin Monday, June 25 and continue through Aug. 3. Most activities are free and are open to children between 8 and 15.

Opening day is reserved for registration at the eight schools where the summer program will be held.

For the north section, these are Middlebelt, Bond, Ter-Mile and Larkshire schools; and for the south section, Longacre, Gill Road, Shaw-wassee and William Grace schools. Registration forms are available now at any of those schools.

Swimming and playground activities are scheduled for alternate days in each section. Swimming days for the north section are Monday and Wednesday, and for the south section, Tuesday and Thursday.

On swimming days, buses will pick children up at the playgrounds between 8:15 and 8:30 a.m. and will return at 3 p.m. Swimmers should bring a lunch and a canvas bag for clothing.

Playground activities include crafts and athletics, and are scheduled for 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. on alternate days.

Both sections will take in a free Tiger baseball game and a 50 cent trip to the zoo during the summer.

The south section will visit the zoo on July 6 and Tiger Stadium on July 14. For the north section, the Tiger game is scheduled for June 30, the zoo for July 20.

Both sections will compete for prizes in various field events July 27, and will join for a trip to Bob-Lo Island on August 3.

Additional information about the summer program is included on the registration form.
