Setting of a date for a vote on the bond resolution was withheld pending approval of the change in the resolution. It was indicated, however, that the special election would probably be held in the latter part of March.

A report from a representative of the school architect's office indicated that the three new elementary schools built in the District last year are now fully completed and will be ready for acceptance by the School Board on Wednesday, February 1. At that time the buildings will be inspected by the Board and officially accepted by the School District.

It was also disclosed that difficulties causing frozen coils at the Gill Road School recently had been overcome and that the school District would in no way be indebted for the expenses involved.

Discussion of a legal opinion on a special transportation levy in the School District and on the use of school buildings for municipal elections were withheld due to a lack of information on the subjects. Naming of school buildings in the District was also tabled, to be discussed at the next meeting of the Board.

The date of the next School Board meeting was moved up from Tuesday, February 14, due to the scheduling of several other programs on the date of the regular School Board meeting.
