New Nursery
School Planned
For Kendallwood

A new children's nursery school is being planned for the residents of Kendallwood. The school will be housed in the facilities of Dr. W. A. Goldberg's Day Camp at 43000 Twelve Mile Road, corner of Beck, on an 11-acre site which has a number of buildings, ample modern sanitation and unusual indoor and outdoor facilities.

Dr. Goldberg, the director, is a native Detroit and a graduate of the University of Michigan and Northwestern University. He has been in the Novi Township area as a day camp operator for over thirty years. He has worked with children for many years, both in the public field as a teacher and privately in day camp work, in his nursery school on Greenwood Road in Oak Park.

The school will serve a mid-day snack to boys and girls from 21 through 4 years of age. Its program will be unusual and varied and will include many trips, games, rhythms, songs, indoor and outdoor play, arts and crafts.

The staff is the certified and well-qualified for its duties. The nursery school will have all necessary local and state licenses. Limited pickup service, by station wagon, will be available.

If there is sufficient demand, the Nursery School will open in September for five days each week through June.

Plans are now complete for the Red Cross Bloodmobile visit to the West Bloomfield Township Hall on Orchard Lake Road from 1:30 to 7:30 p.m. on Monday, February 20.

Primarily in the interests of the Inter-Lakes Blood Bank which insures a supply of blood for the Bond, Eagle, Green, West Vaughn, Roosevelt, Whitfield, Walnut Lake, Franklin and Wing Lake School Districts, donors may also specify that their contribution go to another bank. Release in an emergency is a simple operation for residents of these districts. The chairman of the area is conducted.
