to give each of the state's four regional tourist councils an advertising shot in the arm.

Each received \$25,000 during the past few years. The bill raises it to \$30,000.

The experts say it is "little enough with the higher costs of advertising in national areas, but it is a starter toward getting the state back up among the leaders."

WATER SHORTAGE is a problem for parts of Michigan. Williams sounded the alarm with the old quote: "Water, water everywhere, but not a drop to drink." At least, not enough where it is needed.

Southeastern Michigan communities which annually go through a water shortage are behind a proposal to start a pipeline from either Lake St. Clair or Lake Huron.

It would create a new set of duties for the state Water Resources Commission, set up a \$500,000,000 fund to back up local bond issues and start water flowing into parched communities.

"This problem is more serious than many realize," said Senator William S. Bloomfield (R-Royal Oak). He said his studies have developed evidence that towns now depending on fresh water wells will sooner or later need new sources. "This will be a statewide thing in a few years and we want to be ready for it," he stated.

Georgia's state flag will soon include the stars and bars of the Confederate battle flag, under provisions of a bill passed by her state legislature.
