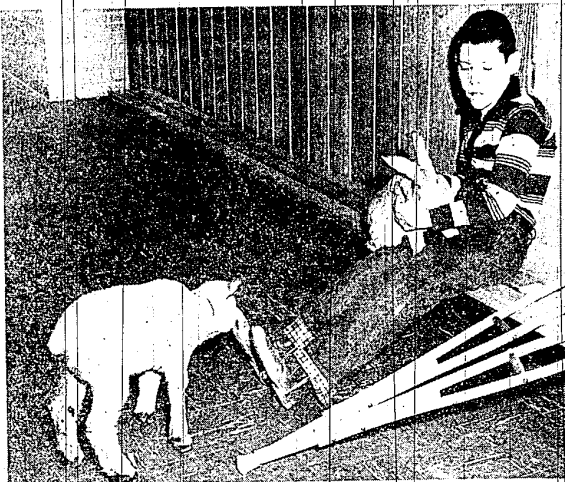

 Mackay, representing Pasadena Subdivision; R. W. Burton, representing Glen Orchard Subdivision; L. W. Beals and L. A. Clingman, representing Farmington Hills Subdivision; Don Rowman, Jerry Masini and Ward Heath representing Springbrook Subdivision; James Lovanb, representing Greenacres Subdivision; Edward Mosier, 26451 Farmington Road, individual citizen; Mr. and Mrs. Ted R.  Representatives of Ridgewood and Ridgewood Manor Subdivisions; Woodbine Subdivision; and Woodcrest Farms Subdivision were invited but did not appear to attend, and are out of this communication.

The meeting was called to order by Doyle Woods, acting chairman. The reasons for the meeting were outlined as follows:
 A Citizens' Water Committee of Farmington Township has been in operation for about eighteen months seeking some source of supply for many homes lacking water in the South and East parts of the Township.

The committee has proposed to drill wells elsewhere in the Township and pipe water to the "dry areas" at a cost of over one and one-half million dollars.
 The Township Board has hired Judge Arthur E. Moore as counsel for the committee, has hired Pats and Ellyn Engineers to lay out the system and has allocated \$2500.00 of Township funds to be used in drilling test wells and securing options on well sites.

Such a water system would undoubtedly affect the rest of the Township directly or indirectly. A general discussion followed. The main points brought out were as follows: It was agreed that all but just as a Voluntary Citizens' Committee.

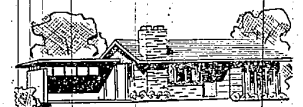
