## Youth Assistance Begins Summer Teen Activities

Teen-agers will again have a place to meet this summer in Farmington. The Summer Activity Center of Farmington Youth Assistance has received funding again this year from the United Community Services (UCS) of Metropolitan Detroit, Oakland Division. This is the center's third year of operation.

"The UCS allocation will cover a portion of our proposed program this summer," said Mrs. Pat Erger, this year's coordinator. She explained that the center aims to reach young people ages 13 through 17. "We will offer a wide variety of activities."

Last year the center offered weekly outings, swimming, movies, games, sports, art projects, informal "traps" and occasional speakers.

"One week last year Jack Mingo, assistant director, brought in a movie camera and the kids made a short feature," Mrs. Erger continued. "They had a great time filming it and then seeing each other 'in the movies.'" Other highlights of the summer were a hayride and a folk concert.

The center is planning more of the same this year — but how much it can do depends on the amount of community support it receives.

Pat Erger explained that since the USC funding will cover only about half of the proposed budget, the rest must come from other sources or parts of the proposed program will have to be curtailed.

"We are beginning to receive some funds from church and civic groups," she said.

The center opens July 9. It will again be located at William Grace Elementary School at 2940 Shawnesse from 3:40 p.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, with field trips on Saturday.

The Farmington Board of Education has adopted a new policy to give public notification of all meetings and open study sessions.

In adopting the new policy, the board agreed to call the newspapers if a meeting or study session is scheduled too late for notification by mail.

Dr. Mervyn Ross attempted to have the policy amended to include notification of all study sessions, whether open to the public or closed. His amendment only drew support from William Corliss. Voting against it were Kathryn Stirling, Elizabeth Brennan, Kenneth Perrin and Ronald Emmett. Aldo Vagnozzi was absent.

Other trustees said it would be a wasted expense to mail notifications of meetings that are closed. They also noted there might be a negative reaction to notifying people of a meeting they were not permitted to attend.

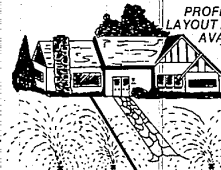
